Isoetes

Description

- Each plant consists of a dense rosette of grass-like hollow leaves that taper to a pointed tip.
- Each clump arises from a distinctive corm, a bulb-like base similar in looks to a miniture onion.
- Leaves are dark green while the base is white.
- Plants can grow singly or in extensive beds (occasionally up 30cm high).
- Can grow to depths exceeding 5m in some South Island lakes.

Similar species

Not to be confused with other turf plants. Always check for distictive corm (bulb like) base. *Isoetes* grow as single plants with no connecting rhizome.

Presence in New Zealand

Throughout New Zealand although they are now rare in northern North Island.

Management Value

The Isoetes species listed here are endemic to New Zealand and have been identified as a key submerged plant indicator for the assessement of lake ecological condition using LakeSPI.
